

### **CBIP Examinations and prerequisites for Certification**

1. CBIP has made the decision that candidates can sit the CBIP examinations who may not yet hold all the required attributes associated with training, skills and experience.
2. It is now possible for a person to pass the examination but not be eligible for certification. Such a person will become eligible for certification only after all training and experience requirements have been met. The board has set a time limit of two years to achieve this. If it takes a candidate longer than two years, the exam results will lapse and a further exam will be required.
3. A letter from CBIP or its service provider advising of exam results is not evidence of certification, and must not be construed as an assurance that certification will be issued, nor may it be presented as evidence of certification.
4. CBIP certificated equipment, welding and NDT inspectors will be considered to hold a current CBIP certification only after the issue of a certificate. A certified person's name will be entered on the website list shortly after that certificate has been issued.
5. Persons whose certification has expired will be removed from the website list shortly after the set expiry date.
6. If a certificate holder has a certificate withdrawn, revoked or suspended, their name will be removed from the website list following that decision by the CBIP Board.
